Since graduating Phi Kappa Phi, from the University of Louisville in the mid 1960s with a Bachelors of Music, Bachelors of Education, and Masters in Theory and Composition, Otto Feddern has pursued several successful careers.



In the field of education, his analytical, organizational, management, and motivational skills allowed him to develop one of the largest instrumental music departments in the State of Kentucky.

After ten years in education, a sales career was next with a major, national fund raising company for schools and youth sports. Rising to the position of General Sales Manager, he was responsible for 300 salesmen and all of the necessary management, forecasting, recruiting, and development tasks. It was here that he met and married Mina, his wife of 27 years.

Otto entered the financial services industry in the Fall of 1984, and since 1987 has been actively pursuing and developing the ultimate proprietary performance monitoring system for Endowments, Foundations, Taft Hartley and ERISA Plans.
